

### "There Is No Greater Love"

A volunteer in a hospital that shared the following story.

"I got to know a little girl named Liz who was suffering from a rare and serious disease. Her only chance of recovery appeared to be a blood transfusion from her 5-year-old brother, who had miraculously survived the same disease and had developed the antibodies needed to combat the illness. The doctor explained the situation to her little brother and asked him if he would be willing to give his blood to help his sister. He hesitated for a moment before taking a deep breath and saying, "Yes I'll do it if it will save her."

As the transfusion progressed, the boy lay in bed next to his sister and smiled, as we all did, as we saw the color returning to her cheeks. Then his face grew pale and his smile faded. He looked up at the doctor and asked with a trembling voice, "Will I start to die right away?"

The little boy had misunderstood the doctor - he thought he was going to have to give his sister all of his blood to save her."

Memorial Day provides us with an opportunity to reflect upon the meaning of sacrifice. We pause to remember those who have given their lives to gain and maintain our freedom; to also remember their families and the loss they have experienced.

Christ calls us to live sacrificially. This does not necessarily mean we have to give our lives for someone; it may simply mean sacrificing our time and ourselves to listen, to help, and to encourage others. It is through our sacrificial living that others will see and experience firsthand the love of Christ – and there is no greater love!
