

"Choose to Fly"

In recent weeks I have noticed the baby geese in Sea Palms. It has been interesting to watch them waddle across the golf course, following their mother and sticking together as much as possible even when they swim in one of the ponds.

Just last week there were nine goslings. But as the days have passed the number has grown smaller. This past weekend I noticed there were only five goslings left. It is apparent there is something around the golf course that is enjoying the goslings more than I am - namely the hawks, snapping turtles, and maybe even a gator.

I have been thinking that if these babies don't learn to fly soon there aren't going to be any left to fly. Grounded they are nothing more than sitting ducks – I mean geese - for things that could potentially cause them harm.

There are times in our faith journeys and in the life of the church that we choose to stick close to one another. We become comfortable swimming in our own pond. When we aren't preparing to fly we become nothing more than sitting geese; vulnerable to those things that could cause us harm-like apathy, complacency, and a lack of trust.

Instead of stepping out in faith we choose to predict every contingency and answer every imaginable question before we dare move forward. We are terrified of getting caught without a rational plan for every action we take or every experience we encounter. To fly we must be willing to trust the wind of the Holy Spirit to lift us up; to give us the confidence we need to soar.

This coming Sunday is Pentecost. It is a day when we join with Christians around the world to celebrate the birth of the church and the gift of the Holy Spirit. Pentecost informs us that our faith journeys do not have to be dull and lifeless. When we trust in Christ and the wind of the Holy Spirit to empower us, God promises in Isaiah 40:30 to renew our strength; that we will soar on wings like eagles; that we will run and not grow weary; that we will walk and not be faint.

I look forward to joining with you in online worship at 11:00am on Sunday as we position ourselves to fly. Have a great weekend!


Notes about Online Worship
