

Disciple 1: Bible Study

Make the most of this "new normal" we find ourselves in. Sign up for the popular Disciple Bible Study 1, taught on zoom this academic year, and increase your knowledge and understanding of God's Word. Learn from short videos by talented Seminary professors, reading and dynamic class discussions. Group members form lasting bonds that outlive the course by many years.

The study gives the Old and New Testaments equal time, emphasizing the wholeness of the Bible as a revelation of God. Each lesson, with a weekly theme, reveals a new aspect to what it means to be a true disciple of Jesus Christ.

The Zoom study will start on Wednesday, September 9, from 4-6 pm and will continue each Wednesday thereafter for 33 weeks (breaking for about a month for Christmas). Zoe Hicks will facilitate the study.

What to Expect Coming Back to In-Person Worship

For the safety of everyone attending in-person:

- We will be performing temperature checks at the doors. We need to ensure that your current temperature is BELOW 100F°.
- The Praise Team, Chancel Choir, Handbell Ringers, among others, will lead the music at the services in the Sanctuary.
- Three of our exterior doors will be open for entrance. The Front Sanctuary door on Ocean Blvd, and two doors in the Gholson Room (rear parking lot) leading towards the Sanctuary.
- Just inside the doors, there will be hand sanitizer, masks, and bulletins for you to pick up. Please pick up your own as you enter.
- Our pews will be emptied of materials, like hymnals, bibles, and registration pads. Words will be displayed on the screens, but please make use of your phone to send us prayer requests or let us know if you are visiting.
- The facility will be cleaned between each service.
- We highly encourage you to wear a mask while you are in the building. Our seating will be Socially Distanced. Please sit 6 feet apart from other family groups. We will have overflow seating available in the Chapel if needed when we reach Socially Distanced capacity.
- When you exit the sanctuary, please exit swiftly, and via the door closest to your seats. When you gather, please do so outside for fellowship. This will help maintain social distancing while in the building.




