

### "What's the Reason?"

We create and maintain memorials for a variety of reasons. The main reason is to help us remember.

While on vacation I decided to take a day with my family to visit Gettysburg Battlefield. As our day neared its end, I realized my wife was more interested in knowing if our hotel had a nice pool. My son had commented, numerous times, that all the monuments looked the same. I realized that my intentions had not been much better. I was less interested in learning the history of the battlefield and the stories behind the monuments and more interested in doing something with my family that I had done as a child. Seeing the battlefield had been nothing more than an activity to help me relive a childhood memory and to fill a day of vacation. There was little if any connection to the battlefield and the reason for the monuments.

Over time memorials can become detached from the events that led to their creation and less relevant to the generations that follow. We can't expect our children and grandchildren to visit memorials and to share the same feelings we may have about a particular day or event. That is why it is more important to help others understand the reason the memorials were created in the first place – why they had meaning in that moment in time, why they still have meaning, and why that meaning will be relevant for years to come.

In a similar way this applies to the church. There are numerous monuments built in the name of religion. But rather than expect others to admire and share the same feelings we have for these monuments we need to share the reason behind them.

So, tell the story of Jesus to your children and your children's children. We want them to appreciate our beautiful church, but more importantly they need to know the reason we are the church – the body of Christ. They need to understand that The Trinity; God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit, is our help in ages past and remains our hope for years to come.

Have a wonderful Memorial Day weekend! We look forward to the gatherings with families and friends, to the sporting events, and to the sales. But at some point, please take a moment to share with those around you the reason we have set this day aside - always remember the reason.
