

Why?

Why are we not having in-person worship inside the church? Why are we having any kind of gathering including outside worship? One thing I have learned from the pandemic is that there are no easy answers and whatever the answer is it's not going to be the answer everyone wants to hear.

The question I hear most is "why?" I confess that I have questioned our limited offerings of worship times especially as I see other churches in our community open for in-person, inside worship. It bothers me as I know it bothers you. But then I am reminded of why our pastors, staff, and lay leadership made the decision to change the worship schedule.

Our decision was strongly influenced by a plea from the hospital chaplain asking the churches in our area to reconsider in-person worship. He wrote, "We are worse than last year in terms of numbers and severity of cases, and it is expected to get even worse. Figure out what you can do with your congregation and know that God is with you as you share the truth with others in love. Our faithful medical staff are overwhelmed. We are blessed to have wonderful physicians, nurses, therapists, and others going to battle for us. Let us go to battle for them as well."

Our church heard this call to action. We realized that in this very different day in time, being the church may not necessarily mean having the doors of the church open for in-person worship. We are being the church by showing solidarity with our medical community and doing our part to help care for our community and each other in these unprecedented times.

Why is the church closed? The church is not closed! We are doing our part to help the least and the lost in troubling times. And we continue to offer the opportunity for in-person worship with the outside service; a service that was well attended and well received. We are being the church!

Thank you for your prayers and faithful support. I miss being together in normal worship and small groups as much as anybody. By making the choices we have made our prayer is that we will have played a small part in keeping ourselves and others healthy, and that in doing so we are helping make the return to normal in our church and community something that happens sooner than later.

I hope you will join us this Sunday at 9:00am on the lawn for in-person worship or for the 11:00am virtual service. We will conclude the series on "Christian Living" with the sermon "Live Like a Winner!"
