

## Anger

The incident at the Oscars this week, when one individual walked on stage and slapped another during the program, has gained international attention. I am not going to defend either of the individuals or their actions, but the incident reminded me of an article I wrote recently about anger.

It's easy for us to get angry these days. We are impatient, on-edge, worried - it doesn't take much to set us off. Even the little things that annoy us can quickly escalate into serious confrontations.

Matthew 5:20-26 does not pull any punches regarding anger and God's call to reconciliation. In this section of the Sermon on the Mount Jesus says, "But I say to you that if you are angry with a brother or sister, you will be liable to judgment." His instruction is clear. As good as it might feel to open the floodgates of anger on someone who has harmed us - don't.

It is impossible to not have angry feelings. The real concern is what we do with those feelings. There is a powerful word of instruction found in Ephesians 4:26: "Be angry, but do not sin." No one can stop anger from happening. Yet we have the power to not let our anger dictate who we are and how we behave.

Is our only option to stifle our anger? No. To do so is not healthy. Fortunately, there is another choice between the two extremes of losing our temper or stifling our feelings - we can name the anger and send it away. Claim it. Own it. Then, send it away. While anger has a legitimate purpose, our goal is to learn to dispose of it properly. In our relationships with others choose to calmly do what needs to be done to restrain our anger while putting the greater part of our energy into building understanding.

This Sunday in worship we will celebrate Holy Communion. The focus of the morning will be on extravagant love. Extravagant love is never wasted. When we choose to control our anger, we are choosing to share God's extravagant, unconditional love with others.
