

Yes or No?

Annie Johnson Flint was a poet. She was orphaned at age 6 and severely afflicted with arthritis in her teens. Before she reached adulthood, she was unable even to walk. Her dream had been to be a composer and concert pianist, but when illness deprived her of the ability to the play the piano, she turned to poetry, pounding out the words on a typewriter with her knuckles after the disease left her unable to open her hands.

She eventually came to see poetry as her calling from God. The following is her testimony to God's grace and love in her life:

He giveth more grace as our burdens grow greater,

He sendeth more strength as our labors increase,

To added afflictions, He addeth His mercy,

To multiplied trials, He multiplies peace.

His love has no limits, His grace has no measure, His power no boundary known unto men;

For out of His infinite riches in Jesus

He giveth, and giveth, and giveth again.

God is always ready to give. Are you willing to say "Yes" to his blessings? He has promised to meet us where we are, to grant us wisdom and guidance, and help move us into a deeper understanding of his great love for each of us. Trust in his promises by saying, "Yes!"

Sometimes it is easier to say "No" to God. We say "No" to God every time we are not hospitable and welcoming to the stranger among us; every time we refuse to love our enemies and pray for those who persecute us; and every time we hesitate to repay evil with blessing.

In this week's sermon we will consider how God intended his love and grace to be shared with all - his love that has no limits and his grace that has no measure. Christ offers these gifts to us - are we willing to receive them?


