## The Way Forward- FAQ on Disaffiliation

The current plan of our church is to hold off on a decision regarding disaffiliation from the United Methodist Church until after the General Conference meets in May 2024. As a means of helping to keep you informed this space is being used to provide routine updates on our church's way forward and answer frequently asked questions.

#### Why does our church continue to stay the course while others are choosing to disaffiliate?

This continues to be the most common question I hear regarding our church's current position. There are others who wonder, "Why are we not meeting like other churches?" The answer is simple: There is no reason to hurry.

The pastoral and lay leadership of the church are closely following what is happening. The message being disseminated by some that we have to move on this now or else is not accurate. Be assured that if at some point we see the need to change our course and to bring this matter before the church, we will. In the meantime, our church will continue to lift-up the name of Jesus and be faithful in our discipleship as we ask for God's blessings on our ministries.
