But, we were still in the process of becoming licensed. Until that happened, there wasn't a job for interested teachers or spots to care for full-time children. There was a lot of prayer, though! Not just me, but an entire church had pledged their faithfulness to this new mission. And as He does, God saw this project through and has continued to make His presence known every day. I get a lot of credit for things, but don't think I don't know that without God's hand in this, and many, many church members, it would still be a part-time school.

I have had the privilege of working with some incredible women over the years. We have always had the BEST families attending our school. Your support, your kindness, and your grace will always be the thing I remember most about you, especially when things have been difficult. I have enjoyed our conversations, and at times, banter. By the way, I forgive you for all the times the FOB was in the other car.

But, let's face it. It's your children I will miss most of all. I LOVE the way they feel free to call me Mary! I LOVE the way they come to me to be entertained when I sit on the floor. I LOVE the way they non-judgmentally listen to my singing. I LOVE the way they grab onto my legs for a hug. I LOVE when they all share with me at the same time. I LOVE to watch them nap and snore. I LOVE their excitement. I LOVE sharing the stories and songs of Jesus with them. I LOVE when I ask them, "Who loves you more than anybody in the whole world?" They say Jesus/God.
