#### Describe the Holy Spirit

This Sunday we will celebrate Pentecost! Pentecost commemorates the birthday of the church! It is the fulfilled promise of Jesus of the Holy Spirit, the advocate God has given us to help us and be with us forever.

Most of us have heard about the Holy Spirit, but I think most would agree that we have difficulty getting our minds wrapped around this holy mystery. Like many things we want the answers to be in black and white, clearly defined, and something we can understand. But the Spirit is something we can't capture because the Spirt moves in ever-creative ways as a beautiful and powerful part of who God is.

As a result, the Holy Spirit has often been described in many different ways. I recently read an article by Lutheran pastor, Vince Gerhardy. His list describing the Holy Spirit is a list that can never be complete, but still helps remind us of some of the ways the Spirit works and continues to work among us.

He is like a breath that blows away the dust and makes everything clean.

He is like refreshing cool water to a parched throat.

He is like a cleansing brush fire that burns away all the thick undergrowth so that something new can rise out of the ashes. He is like a potter who starts with an odd-shaped lump and molds and shapes it into something beautiful.

He is like a renovator who uses what is already there and strengthens, refreshes and revitalizes what's there.

He is like a loving spouse whispering reassurances of love and support.

He is like a parent guiding and helping a confused child.

He is like a tour guide who points us in the right direction to see things that we would otherwise have missed.

He is that gentle tap on the shoulder that makes us realize, "Hey, that's me that needs a new beginning and new direction."

That is what the Holy Spirit does - he revitalizes, renews, refreshes, empowers, creates, he reminds, he guides, he comforts the church, those in the church and those whom he touches outside the church. Thanks be to God!

#### The Way Forward- A Message from Tom Jones Clarifying the Current Position of our Church

In worship this past week I shared the following comments with the congregation in response to concerns expressed about last week's article in the worship guide. The article was mostly comprised of excerpts from a letter written by Bishop David Graves.

The article was written with the intent being to make you aware of the called Annual Conference that was held on Sunday, May 21. The purpose of the called conference was to approve the local churches in South Georgia that have made the decision to disaffiliate from the United Methodist Church, something you will more than likely hear about in the news.

In my effort to keep you informed ahead of the media, some interpreted the article to mean that the decision had already been made and that St. Simons United Methodist will not depart from the UMC. This is not an accurate reading of the article which said, "Following the General Conference in April 2024, <u>we as a church family</u> will give further consideration to the future of our church."

The Leadership Team and Church Council agreed early on that it was in the best interest of our church to wait to make any decisions. We chose to approach this time as a season of discernment and prayer. We felt there was no reason to hurry or to feel pressured into becoming a part of a fledgling denomination, another established denomination, or to take on the unique challenges that come with being an independent church.

We have until the end of 2024 to determine our next steps which may, or may not, include a vote to depart the UMC. In the meantime, there will be opportunities provided for our church family to enter into open and heartfelt discussions regarding departure.

I hope this clears up some concerns as well as helps limit the rumors that are being spread. If people choose to say negative things about our church, please remind them of how God has blessed our church as we continue to emphasize making disciples of Jesus Christ and following his command to love others as God has loved us.

In the words of Romans 15:5: May the God of steadfastness and encouragement grant us to live in harmony with one another, in accordance with Christ Jesus, so that together we may with one voice glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ.
