As we celebrate the birth of our nation, one of the greatest strengths of our country is that even in our multiplicity of differences - we the people remain indivisible. Let's work toward even greater cohesiveness by practicing kindness and by being conduits of hope; let's do our part to help heal the differences that can tear us apart. Remember the pledge we have so often made - to be "one nation under God, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all."
