



The Reason We Serve

One of my favorite stories is one told by the evangelist Tony Campolo. There was an alcoholic who was miraculously converted at a mission worship service. Prior to his conversion, Joe had gained the reputation of being a person whose only hope was to live a miserable existence in the ghetto.

But after asking Christ into his life everything changed. Joe became the most caring person that anyone associated with the mission had ever known. He spent his days at the mission doing whatever task needed to be done. There was no job that was too lowly for Joe. He did everything with a smile on his face. He could be counted on to clean the bathrooms, which tended to become extremely filthy. He was willing to feed feeble men who wandered off the street into the mission. He could be counted on to tuck men into bed who were too out of it to take care of themselves.

One evening, during a worship service one of the men in the mission came forward to kneel and pray. He cried out for God to help him to change. The repentant man kept shouting, "Oh God, make me like Joe! Make me like Joe!" The director of the mission leaned over and said to the man, "I think it would be better if you prayed, 'Make me like Jesus!'" The man looked up at the director with a puzzled expression on his face and asked, "Is he like Joe?"

This story reminds us of an important truth. That the first real communication of anything spiritual usually comes through people like us who demonstrate loving humility in the routine of our daily events. When you share the humble spirit of Christ in the workplace, at school, at home, or wherever you are, always keep in mind and in your prayers that you may in that moment have become the catalyst for change in a person's heart.

Let your life be an accurate reflection of Jesus, who "being in very nature God, did not consider equality with God something to be grasped, but made himself nothing, taking the very nature of a servant..." Philippians 2:6-7

Maybe someday someone will want to be like you. You will have helped that person discover the source of unconditional love and acceptance found only in Jesus Christ – the one who is the reason we serve.
