



Practice Integrity

Is there any value to integrity? Some would say there is far less value to being truthful and honest. Lies and deceit have become normalized. We almost expect others to be dishonest in their dealing with us. Our own actions if examined closely can sometimes be questionable. But does it matter. Is living with integrity even relevant today?

I have heard it said that there is little value in being truthful. I beg to differ. Being truthful has actually become more valuable, to the point of being priceless. Integrity put into practice stands out as being golden in a day when we have learned to expect and even accept the worst in one another.

There was a pastor who had been shopping. After leaving the store he realized he had been given too much change. He returned to the checkout and said to the person there, "I believe you gave me too much money." The clerk said, "I know I did." "You know you did," said the pastor, "Why did you do that?" The clerk responded, "I was thinking about coming to your church on Sunday to hear you preach. I wanted to be sure you were worth listening to."

Scripture is filled with passages urging integrity in believers. Some of them are well-known commands for Christian living. Like Galatians 5:22-23: "But the Holy Spirit produces this kind of fruit in our lives: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. There is no law against these things!"

Such a list is a command to live a life of the highest integrity, a life that brings goodness and blessings to all people. In short, the Christian command to integrity is a command to both talk and walk in the way of Jesus. It's a life marked by love, compassion, mercy, justice, and honoring God's call above everything else.

A church with integrity follows this command because there is nothing more important than being the undivided body of Christ in the world. People are drawn to a church that makes every effort "to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace" (Ephesians 4:3). We cannot share the good news of Jesus Christ if we're putting all of our energy into our disagreements.

Still there are times when critical issues cannot be ignored. The apostle Paul recommends the practice of "speaking the truth in love." This means that we speak the truth that has been revealed to us by God, but we do it in love, without belittling or beating up the people who disagree with us.

Integrity practiced within our personal lives can be life-altering for us as well as have the potential to influence others for good. The same is true for a church that remains committed to humility, gentleness, patience, bearing with one another, and speaking the truth in love. To be a church that is committed to maintaining unity of the Spirit and oneness in Christ. To be a church that practices integrity. Blessings,

2023 Annual Report

Our church has grown and been blessed by your generous giving and faith! St. Simons UMC received \$1,260,748.05 in contributions in 2023. Our expenses for 2023 were \$1,221,121.81 and all apportionments and ministry commitments were met. Expenses were under budget by \$4,533.19. Contributions exceeded the budget by \$35,143.17.

We added 103 new member in 2023, and ended the year with 1193 members. The church has 181 pledges for 2024 totaling \$883,680.00.
