

Prior to being appointed to St. Simons UMC, I served as the pastor at St. Mary's UMC for four years. It was a time of transition for my family and me from the North Georgia Conference back into the South Georgia Conference. My family stayed in Marietta during that time because we wanted to get our sons through high school there. Our daughter Croft was only four. We were able to see each other every 6-8 weeks when she and Anne would travel to St. Marys to be with me for visits

Over those four years, as Croft got a little older and wiser, she began to realize that whenever they left to return to Marietta it was going to be a long time before she saw her daddy again. In the initial stages of their going back and forth it was just me that had tears in my eyes when they left; but as she began to understand what was happening there were also tears in her eyes.

On one occasion when Anne began to pull away in the car to leave, Croft told her mother to stop. She called me over to the open window where she was sitting. When I got there, she put her hand to her heart and said the words I will always remember: "Daddy, you have my heart." I smiled, doing my best to hold back my tears until they left, but her words left an indelible imprint on my heart.

The season of Lent is a season of penitence. As we move into this season of reflection and remembering the sacrifice Christ made for us I am reminded of the unending love of our Heavenly Father. I have decided that my personal prayers during Lent will begin with the words, "Lord, you have my heart." How can I, how can we give him anything less when we consider how God sacrificed his only son for the forgiveness of our sins?

During the weeks of Lent, as we prepare to celebrate Easter, I encourage you to use the words of a little girl in your personal prayer life; "You have my heart." I've got to believe a prayer like that will make God smile.

May God's guidance be with us as we begin our journey to the cross.

The Way Forward FAQ

How often does the General Conference meet?

The General Conference meets every four years. The bar of the conference is comprised of an equal number of clergy delegates and lay persons elected from Annual Conferences around the world. Bishops preside over the conference but have no voice or vote. It is at the General Conference that the polity of the United Methodist church is established for the next four years and is entered into The Book of Discipline. The General Conference will convene this year from April 23 to May 3 in Charlotte, North Carolina. One of the key agenda items will include the continued discussion on human sexuality and whether the current language regarding this matter should change. It is important to remember that the current guidelines from the 2016 Book of Discipline have not changed and could potentially not be amended at this General Conference. 
- First time guests please fill out the yellow, "Welcome Card" located in your pew. Please drop in the offering plate or bring to the Welcome Desk to receive a gift!
