

Playing a Role or Being Real?

Ask a Christian to describe other Christians and the answers likely will be "giving," "compassionate," "loving" and "respectful." That means we are playing our roles well. Our actions and our words among ourselves can be identified with those of Jesus.

But before we rise to quickly to our feet to give ourselves standing ovations for the leading and supporting roles we play as a people of faith there is something else we should consider. If you ask a non-Christian to describe Christians we are likely to hear words like "hypocritical," "judgmental," and "selfrighteous." Non-Christians are far more likely to say Christians do not represent the teachings of Jesus. Christians say one thing but perform in ways that are confusing and often misleading.

These responses are the results of a survey conducted by the Episcopal Church that illustrates stark differences between how Christians and non-Christians view Christianity in the United States. "There is a disconnect between the reality of Jesus and the perceived reality of Christians," said Bishop Michael Curry, presiding bishop of the Episcopal Church.

If you ask today's "nones" people who have drifted away from the church - what led to their departure, chances are one reason will top the list: too many hypocrites in the church. But if that's their only reason for leaving, their logic is flawed. The simple truth is, there have always been hypocrites in church. A guick read of some of Paul's letters will confirm that as will gospel stories like the one about James and John, who try to muscle each other out of the way in a game of heavenly musical chairs to determine who will be seated next to God.

It has been said that Christian hypocrites are like counterfeit money. But here's the thing about counterfeits: no one has ever stopped using real money because of them. It's just as foolish to step away from the church of Jesus Christ, where there's so much real value that can be found nowhere else.

Don't let pretend Christians distract you from what's real. Don't be a pretend Christian that causes others to be distracted. Let's choose to be real. Faith is not a show – it's a way of living – it's an everyday reality. Let's do our part to change the world's perception of the church and of Christians. Listen and respond to Jesus and his example of sacrificial living. Give up your own way; take up your cross and follow him.

The Way Forward FAQ

Why have other United Methodist Churches left the denomination?

There are numerous reasons that church's have chosen to depart the UMC. Over the next four weeks we will address what are considered to be the top four reasons. The first and most obvious point of contention is our divide over human sexuality. The 2016 Book of Discipline states the United Methodist clergy will not conduct gay marriages and that gay marriages cannot be held in United Methodist Churches. It also prohibits practicing homosexuals from being ordained. There is concern among more traditional leaning United Methodists that this language will change at this year's General Conference. Church's decided they no longer wanted to be a part of this discussion and opted to leave the UMC based on what could potentially happen. Our church leadership decided to stay the course until after the General Conference and the South Georgia Annual Conference and to base any decisions about the future of our church on facts rather than speculation.
