This week we continue to explore the question-

# "Why have other United Methodist Churches made the decision to depart the denomination?"

One reason is the concern about a lack of accountability for those who work outside the parameters of our denomination's rules. In general, it is agreed that accountability within our denomination needs to be addressed and corrected. This work is currently being done through our Council of Bishops. Much attention, including media attention, has been given to a small percentage of bishops and pastors who have said and done things that are foolish. It is a critical point to remember that no one person or group of people can say or do anything that represents or speaks for the United Methodist Church; only the General Conference has that authority. It is also important to understand that The General Conference is bound to uphold the Articles of Religion that reaffirm our basic beliefs as found in the Apostles Creed. The Articles of Religion can never be debated or changed; they will always be included in The Book of Discipline. These beliefs are the cornerstone of the United Methodist Church. They cannot; they will not be changed.
