There are those of us who would like to have a better idea about the direction of our lives. We can become overwhelmed by the options and the differing opinions offered to us; opinions that often come in the form of so-called good advice. As a result we tend to look for shortcuts and, as it sometimes turns out when we choose a shortcut, we can become lost or arrive at a dead end.

If we are to follow God's direction there are few, if any, reliable shortcuts. To grow in our faith requires us to have a simple, childlike understanding of God's love, care, and faithfulness to us. It may require getting back to the basics of our faith; to remembering the words of arguably the most familiar scripture verse in all the Bible - John 3:16.

A man by the name of Max told the story of how he was just an old drunk. The only directions he needed were for someone to point him to the next bottle of whiskey. The next drink dominated his thoughts. The direction of his life was a downward spiral. He said, "I was rescued by the gospel. I'm not just stating that. I was rescued. I mean, I was a train going over the cliff and the gospel really rescued me. The question for me was not "Is there a God?" The question was, "Could God forgive a jerk like me?" And John 3:16 says, "Yes, for God so loved Max that he gave his one and only son."

If you are contemplating the best direction for your life, sometimes it simply helps to remember that God so loves you. Follow his directions. No one can argue with that.

# The Way Forward FAQ

This week we continue to explore the question, "Why have other United Methodist Churches made the decision to depart the denomination?" Fear is one reason. The fear of the unknown can be paralyzing. While none of us know what the future holds, what we do know is that nothing in the Book of Discipline has changed since 2016 regarding the UMC's position on same sex marriages and the ordination of homosexuals. One of the fears that has seemed to have driven the decision of numerous departing churches was their church property; fears that our Lay Leadership Group realized were mostly unfounded. The Trust Clause has been in our Book of Discipline since 1797. The Trust Clause requires each local church to hold in trust for the denomination all property and assets. What this means more than anything else is that our property will be used as a church. Some have suggested that the UMC is using the Trust Clause to hold local churches hostage; that churches like ours could ultimately have to pay millions of dollars to depart if we don't choose to get out now. The fact of the matter is that local churches have always had an option to depart provided in the Book of Discipline. The United Methodist Church has never approached the departure of a local church as solely a property issue. While some agreement of payments to the annual conference would be made, as is being done now, the UMC would not attempt to sell us our property which we own and is deeded to St. Simons UMC. The fear over property matters has served to be more of a distraction from the real issues being considered in our denomination and should not be considered as a threat to our church.


