Many Methodists are admittedly clueless about the Book of Discipline; some can't name the bishop in their annual conference; still others have never been to an Annual Conference or met a General Conference delegate. It has been said that in this lack of concern for Methodism beyond the local church that these individuals have things in proper perspective. What the United Methodist Church does is largely irrelevant to their encounter with Christ and contributes little to their taking responsibility for the mission that Christ has assigned to their congregation. Whatever decisions are made in the weeks and months ahead, St. Simons UMC will continue to focus on being a church committed to welcoming all and making disciples of Jesus Christ.


