

## World Communion Sunday

World Communion Sunday is observed on the first Sunday of October by many Christian denominations, including the United Methodist Church. This special day emphasizes the unity and inclusiveness of the global Christian community. It began in the 1930s in the United States as a way to reflect on our shared faith and the importance of coming together as one body in Christ.

On this day churches around the world celebrate the Eucharist, also referred to as Holy Communion or the Lord's Supper. Various methods of serving the bread and the cup will be put into practice. Some of us will read the ritual and pray the Lord's Prayer in English; others will participate using different languages. But no matter how communion is served or how our prayers are prayed, all parts of the ritual point us towards the same love and forgiveness that is offered to everyone in Jesus Christ through his sacrifice on the cross.

The story is told of a four-year-old boy who was in church with his mother. When the cup and bread were offered, his mother leaned oved and told him he was not old enough to take part in communion. Later on in the service, the offering plate was passed but the little boy ignored it. His mother again leaned over to her son again, this time to tell him to put the dollar she had given to him into the offering plate. He refused to give up his dollar saying, "If I can't eat, I'm not paying."

The invitation to the Lord's Table is open to all. You will hear me say in our worship services that "this is not the United Methodist's table; it is the Lord's table, and all are welcome." This invitation includes persons of any age and any background. All are invited to the table as we gather to remember that Jesus gave himself for the world; to remember that it is God's love and sacrifice that binds us together - in our church and with Christians everywhere. Jesus said, "I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never be hungry again. Whoever believes in me will never be thirsty. (John 6:35). As followers of Jesus, we are called to celebrate his life-giving presence; to be reminded that even in our differences, we are "one with Christ, one with each other, and one in ministry to all the world."
