

Think Small

One day my daughter noticed that I had some change in my hand. She was only three at the time, so she had a poor concept about the value of money — something we continue to work on in her teen years. In that moment she asked if she could have the money in my hand. I had a nickel and a dime. I was curious to see what would happen if I offered her a choice to take just one of the two coins. She chose the nickel. I asked her why. Her response was not a surprise: "It was bigger than the other one." I tried to explain that the dime, as small as it was, had more value. That didn't matter to her, she wanted the larger of the two coins.

It can be easy to overlook the value of small things. Jesus reminds us of this in Matthew 13 when he tells stories about a mustard seed, yeast, treasure hidden in a field, and a pearl of great value. These parables serve to teach us that the kingdom of heaven often reveals itself in small and surprising ways, and that small things can ultimately have a considerable influence on the world.

The first step to doing bigger things for God is to think small. Our small acts of kindness, caring, and understanding can lead to great things being accomplished. It's in sharing our simple gifts that others experience the tremendous value of God's love and grace in their lives.

In my younger days I played church league softball. I will always remember that anytime one of us came up to bat our teammates would encourage us, almost beg us, to just get a hit. It was a good reminder because too often our approach at the plate was to swing for the fences wanting to knock the ball out of the park. Too often the end result of our big swing was an easy out, when if we had focused on simply getting a hit we would have helped set-up the team to score more runs.

Too many of us become discouraged in our faith journeys because we constantly try to hit homeruns when Jesus is encouraging us to just get a hit. Our call is to not worry so much about doing remarkable things, but to give of our best in all things – even if they seem small.

Think small. In doing so you will be doing your part to help the kingdom of heaven grow and prosper. Working together, the seemingly insignificant things we accomplish will be transformed into greater things for our church, for our community, and for God.


