Hosea 11: 1-11 - The Lord's Love for Israel

¹ "When Israel was a child, I loved him, and I called my son out of Egypt.
² But the more I called to him, the farther he moved from me,

- offering sacrifices to the images of Baal and burning incense to idols. ³I myself taught Israel how to walk, leading him along by the hand.
- But he doesn't know or even care that it was I who took care of him. ⁴I led Israel along with my ropes of kindness and love.
- I lifted the yoke from his neck, and I myself stooped to feed him.
- ⁵ "But since my people refuse to return to me, they will return to Egypt and will be forced to serve Assyria.

- among you, and I will not come to destroy. ¹⁹ For someday the people will follow me. I, the Lord, will roar like a lion. And when I roar,
- my people will return trembling from the west. ¹Like a flock of birds, they will come from Egypt.
- Trembling like doves, they will return from Assyria. And I will bring them home again," says the Lord.


