TODAYS MESSAGE The Search for Utopia

Isaiah 65:17-25

"Look! I am creating new heavens and a new earth, and no one will even think about the old ones anymore. ¹⁸ Be glad; rejoice forever in my creation! And look! I will create Jerusalem as a place of happiness. Her people will be a source of joy. ¹⁹ I will rejoice over Jerusalem and delight in my people. And the sound of weeping and crying will be heard in it no more. ²⁰ "No longer will babies die when only a few days old. No longer will adults die before they have lived a full life. Our Wesleyan Heritage

This Sunday, we celebrate our Wesleyan Heritage - a rich tradition that continues to shape our faith, our church, and our mission today.

We are blessed to live in this beautiful part of God's creation. For United Methodists, the blessing is twofold—not only do we enjoy the natural beauty of the Golden Isles, but we are also surrounded by history that connects us to the roots of our faith. Right here on St. Simons Island, we walk in the footsteps of John and Charles Wesley, founders of the Methodist movement.

In 1733, General James Oglethorpe founded the colony of Georgia, the last of the original thirteen colonies, to serve as a buffer against Spanish expansion from the south. A year later, after establishing the city of Savannah, Oglethorpe sailed down the inland waterway in search of a strategic location for a fort. He chose St. Simons Island.

In 1736, John and Charles Wesley answered Oglethorpe's invitation to join him in Georgia. Their charge was to minister both to the settlers and to the Native Americans. John remained primarily in Savannah, while Charles journeyed with Oglethorpe to St. Simons, where Fort Frederica was established. Charles served as Oglethorpe's secretary and as the pastor to the Frederica community, though his time there proved to be emotionally, physically, and spiritually difficult.

John made five trips from Savannah to support Charles, spending a total of 100 days on St. Simons Island. Despite many challenges, the Wesleys helped lay the foundations of a Christian community here. The congregation they developed on the island lives on today as **Christ Church, Frederica**. Meanwhile, John Wesley's ministry in Savannah included the founding of **Christ Church, still an active church in downtown Savannah**, and the development of what would become Sunday School.

Though their time in Georgia was marked by hardship, the Wesley brothers' legacy has endured. At the heart of Wesleyan theology is the belief that God's grace is available to all and that we are called to grow in that grace through faithful, disciplined Christian living. John Wesley referred to this as *"practical divinity"* - faith in action, love lived out in everyday life.

That same spirit of practical divinity is alive and well here at **St. Simons United Methodist Church**, where we remain committed to our mission: **To make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of St. Simons Island and the world.**

What a gift it is to be part of a tradition that began nearly 300 years ago and continues to inspire hearts and change lives today. Blessings,
