

Thank a Veteran

On November 11, 1918, World War I came to and with the signing of the Armistice by the Allies and Germany. The agreement was intended to bring fighting to an immediate stop to pave the way for peace talks.

In the first Armistice Day proclamation in 1919, President Woodrow Wilson called for the nation to remember those who had died in their country's service and to make the day an opportunity for America to "show her sympathy with peace and justice in the councils of the nation."

Armistice Day became Veteran's Day by an act of Congress in 1954. President Dwight Eisenhower called on the nation to remember the sacrifices of those who fought in all our nation's wars, to celebrate the contributions of all veterans of military service, and to rededicate ourselves to the task of promoting an enduring peace.

We are reminded almost daily of the high cost of freedom and the constant threat to the ideologies we value. A vast chasm of hatred separates people and nations from the hope of enduring peace.

While enduring peace may never be a reality in our world the question becomes, "Is enduring peace possible in us?" Yes, from the moment we accept the grace of God offered to us through Jesus Christ. A vital step towards the possibility of peace in our world is to find the peace within ourselves that only God can provide.

As we celebrate Veteran's Day this week, take the opportunity to contact at least one veteran and say, "Thank you." As we approach the season of Thanksgiving, one of the many things we should be grateful for is the service our veterans have given and for the sacrifices they and their families have made to help promote justice and maintain our freedom - with the hope that one day peace - enduring peace - will prevail.

Weekly Bible Reading Highlights

What did you highlight in your Bible November 2-8? These are a few verses that stood out to Tom:

Mark 15:37-39 - Then Jesus uttered another loud cry and breathed his last. And the curtain in the sanctuary of the Temple was torn in two, from top to bottom.

When the Roman officer who stood facing him saw how he had died, he exclaimed, "This man truly was the Son of God!"

John 20:14-16 - Mary turned to leave and saw someone standing there. It was Jesus, but she didn't recognize him. Dear woman, why are you crying?" Jesus asked her. "Who are you looking for? "She thought he was the gardener. "Sir," she said, "if you have taken him away, tell me where you have put him, and I will go and get him." "Mary!" Jesus said. She turned to him and cried out, "Rabboni!" (which is Hebrew for "Teacher").

John 20:30-31 - The disciples saw Jesus do many other miraculous signs in addition to the ones recorded in this book. But these are written so that you may continue to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that by believing in him you will have life by the power of his name.

Acts 1:8 - "But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you. And you will be my witnesses, telling people about me everywhere—in Jerusalem, throughout Judea, in Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."

Acts 2:1-4 - On the day of Pentecost all the believers were meeting together in one place. Suddenly, there was a sound from heaven like the roaring of a mighty windstorm, and it filled the house where they were sitting. Then, what looked like flames or tongues of fire appeared and settled on each of them. And everyone present was filled with the Holy Spirit.
