Merry Christmas, Merry Christmas

Bursting with energy and celebration, Merry Christmas, Merry Christmas opens our worship with joyful proclamation. Blending John Williams' familiar themes from Home Alone with vibrant choral writing, the piece invites us to lift our voices in praise for the wondrous gift of Christ's birth. The text—enhanced with personalized lyrics such as "Go tell it on the highest mountaintop that Jesus Christ is born"—calls us to announce the good news with confidence and delight. As the choir sings of hope, joy, and the miracle of the Savior's coming, this anthem sets a spirit of welcome and wonder, ushering us into a service filled with gratitude for the Light who has entered our world.

Let All Mortal Flesh Keep Silence

This dramatic opening invites the congregation into holy awe as we gather at the edge of the Christmas story. With ancient words from the Liturgy of St. James, the choir contemplates the mystery of Christ descending to earth, bringing blessing and hope in His hands. Mary McDonald's arrangement heightens the sense of expectation, calling us to pause, reflect, and prepare for the unfolding of God's redemptive plan.

Hope Is Dawning

Joyful and energetic, Hope Is Dawning announces the good news proclaimed to the shepherds on the night of Christ's birth. Drawing from Luke 2:11–12, Mary McDonald's music bursts with the excitement of Emmanuel—God with us—entering the world. The rhythmic drive, bright harmonies, and repeated call of "Noel!" echo the heavenly song of the angels, celebrating Christ the Lord, the Word made flesh. As the choir sings "Glory to the Lord most high," the anthem becomes a vibrant declaration that the Savior has come, and with Him arrives light, peace, and unshakable hope for all people.

Come, Jesus, Heavenly Light

Rooted in the prophecies of Isaiah and Jeremiah, Come, Jesus, Heavenly Light is a prayerful invitation for Christ—the promised Light—to break into a weary and shadowed world. The anthem begins with a reflective narration recalling the ancient promises of a Savior who would bring justice, peace, and righteousness. As the music opens, flowing lines and gentle lyricism express the longing of God's people: "Come to set Thy people free." The piece gradually blossoms into a radiant declaration of hope. Jesus is hailed as the heavenly Light, the Son of love, and the One who brings freedom, comfort, and joy to every longing heart. With a soaring melodic sweep and luminous harmonies, the anthem celebrates the fulfillment of God's promise—Christ our Savior has come, and His light transforms all who receive Him.

My Soul Sings

Inspired by the gospel narratives of Mary and the angelic announcement of Jesus' birth, My Soul Sings is a tender and expressive anthem that echoes the heart of the Magnificat. The opening narration recalls God's surprising work in the lives of Zechariah and Elizabeth, setting the stage for Mary's own encounter with divine promise. As the soloist begins, the music gently unfolds Mary's astonishment and trust: "Be it to me according to Your Word." The piece rises into a joyful declaration as Mary proclaims, "My soul sings of the greatness of my God!" Rich harmonies and flowing lines paint her overflowing praise, rejoicing in God's faithfulness, mercy, and strength. The anthem also foretells the child to come—Emmanuel, "God with us"—whose light will break into darkness and bring hope to all people.

I Wonder as I Wander

This luminous setting of the Appalachian carol invites us to ponder the mystery of Christ's birth with fresh wonder. Pederson's arrangement weaves the familiar melody through shimmering piano lines and gentle choral textures, painting the night sky beneath which the Savior entered our world. New text added by the composer deepens the message, reminding us that the "light of the heavens is born in this child" and that Christ offers His own heart so that "others may live." Both haunting and hopeful, the piece calls us to gaze into the manger with awe and gratitude—marveling that the Prince of Peace came for all, especially "the poor and the small."

Our Lord, Emmanuel

Set to the beloved melody O Little Town of Bethlehem, Our Lord, Emmanuel reflects with wonder on the quiet miracle of Christ's birth. The narration opens with Joseph and Mary's journey to Bethlehem and the fulfillment of prophecy, leading into tender phrases that describe the stillness and mystery of that holy night. As the choir sings of the "everlasting Light" shining in the world's darkness, the anthem weaves familiar imagery with rich new harmonies that deepen the sense of awe. The music expands into a declaration of who this child is—Prince of Peace, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Wonderful Counselor—before returning to a heartfelt refrain: "Our Lord, Emmanuel!"

How Great Our Joy

Drawing inspiration from the traditional German carol, How Great Our Joy retells the shepherds' story with vivid energy and jubilant praise. The narration recounts the angel's startling appearance in the fields and the heavenly proclamation: "Fear not! I bring you good news of great joy." As the choir enters, bright rhythms and buoyant melodies echo the shepherds' excitement as they travel to Bethlehem to see the Christ Child. The anthem unfolds into a celebration of the Savior's mission—born to redeem all people—and the choir proclaims the gift of God dwelling among us. Refrains of "How great our joy!" capture the wonder and delight of that holy night.

In Bethlehem

In Bethlehem is a beautifully reflective and deeply expressive anthem painting the Nativity with both intimacy and awe. The piece opens with a gentle, flowing accompaniment as the text describes the long journey toward the little town where "Heaven's King on earth would soon appear." Rather than a royal welcome, the Savior enters the world quietly—no bed prepared, no crown awaiting—only a humble stable. The anthem grows into a radiant proclamation: "See our Mighty God has done great things!" before turning to a tender prayer of adoration for Jesus, the Child who brings peace, hope, and salvation.

Sing We Noel

Sing We Noel bursts with the joy and wonder of Christmas, blending a lively French carol spirit with vibrant choral writing. The opening narration recalls the shepherds bowing before the Christ Child, inviting us to join their worship. The choir enters with a bright refrain—"Sing now of Christmas, Noel!"—lifting grateful praise for the Savior's birth. Energetic rhythms and expressive lines proclaim, "The King is born, Noel!" culminating in a triumphant declaration of Christmas joy.

Silent Night, Child of Light

Silent Night, Child of Light brings together the beloved carol Silent Night with expressive new text, illuminating Christ as the Light of the World. The narration recalls Jesus' promise: "I am the Light of the world," leading into gentle carol phrases that reflect the stillness of Bethlehem. New refrains proclaim Jesus as Child of God, Prince of Peace, Emmanuel, and Child of Light. The anthem closes with a radiant affirmation: "Christ the Savior is born."

Sleep Little Lion, Sleep Little Lamb

Sleep Little Lion, Sleep Little Lamb is a tender and evocative lullaby contemplating the mystery of the newborn Christ—the mighty Lion of Judah and the gentle Lamb of God. With expressive writing and the incorporation of ABERYSTWYTH, the music cradles imagery of innocence, strength, and divine purpose. Repeated refrains—"Sleep little Lion, sleep little Lamb"—foreshadow the mission He will one day fulfill while honoring the sacred stillness of His birth night.

Worship Christ, the Newborn King

Worship Christ, the Newborn King is a vibrant and festive conclusion that invites both choir and congregation to sing together. Mary McDonald weaves beloved carols—Hark! the Herald Angels Sing, Angels from the Realms of Glory, and O Come, All Ye Faithful—into a triumphant tapestry of praise. Building to the great refrain, "Come and worship, Christ the newborn King!" the anthem becomes a joyous celebration shared by all gathered in worship.

James 2:14 - What good is it, dear brothers and sisters, if you say you have faith but don't show it by your actions?

1 Timothy 2:1 - I urge you, first of all, to pray for all people. Ask God to help them; intercede on their behalf, and give thanks for them.
